In 2007, two families transformed 89 acres of empty farmland into Peacehaven Community Farm. Peacehaven is a nurturing, supportive community where the core values of community, relationships, and growth are lived out daily.

- **Community** reflects our central mission of meeting the basic need to belong. The value of community is lived out in expanding circles that begin with the community of those sharing life together in our homes at the farm.
- **Relationships** are the lifeblood of Peacehaven. We build and maintain healthy relationships with self, others, community partners, donors, and guests.
- **Growth** includes individual growth, organizational growth, and the seasonal growth that takes place on a farm.
- **Compassion** is our “keystone” practice, and the foundation for Peacehaven. We practice compassion for ourselves, others, our communities, and our land and resources.
- **Servant Leadership** is practiced through leading by serving others, with mutuality of power and humility of the self.
- **Sustainability:** We operate with practices that function not solely for short-term gains; but for the long-term flourishing of Peacehaven as an organization, the individuals who belong to the Peacehaven community, and the environment. This includes sustainability of people, energy, agriculture, building, and finances.
